

## 1 Egypt as transit point to other countries (source: unodc.org – Egypt country profile)

Counter-narcotic efforts are controlled by the Anti-Narcotic General Administration (ANGA), which is part of the Ministry of Interior. ANGA is the oldest drug control agency in the world established in 1929. It is headed by an Assistant Minister (currently General Ahmed Samak) and has branch offices in all major cities, airports and ports. It conducts year-round cannabis eradication and an annual opium poppy eradication campaign. ANGA has been both a regular and an active participant in the Arab Office for Narcotic Affairs which is part of the Arab Interior Ministers Council (AMIC) of the League of Arab States. ANGA is also regularly attends CND meetings.

The Government of Egypt continues to aggressively pursue a comprehensive drug control strategy that was developed in 1998. ANGA, the Egyptian Ministry of Interior, the Coast Guard, the Customs Service, and select military units all cooperate in task forces designed to interdict narcotics shipments. 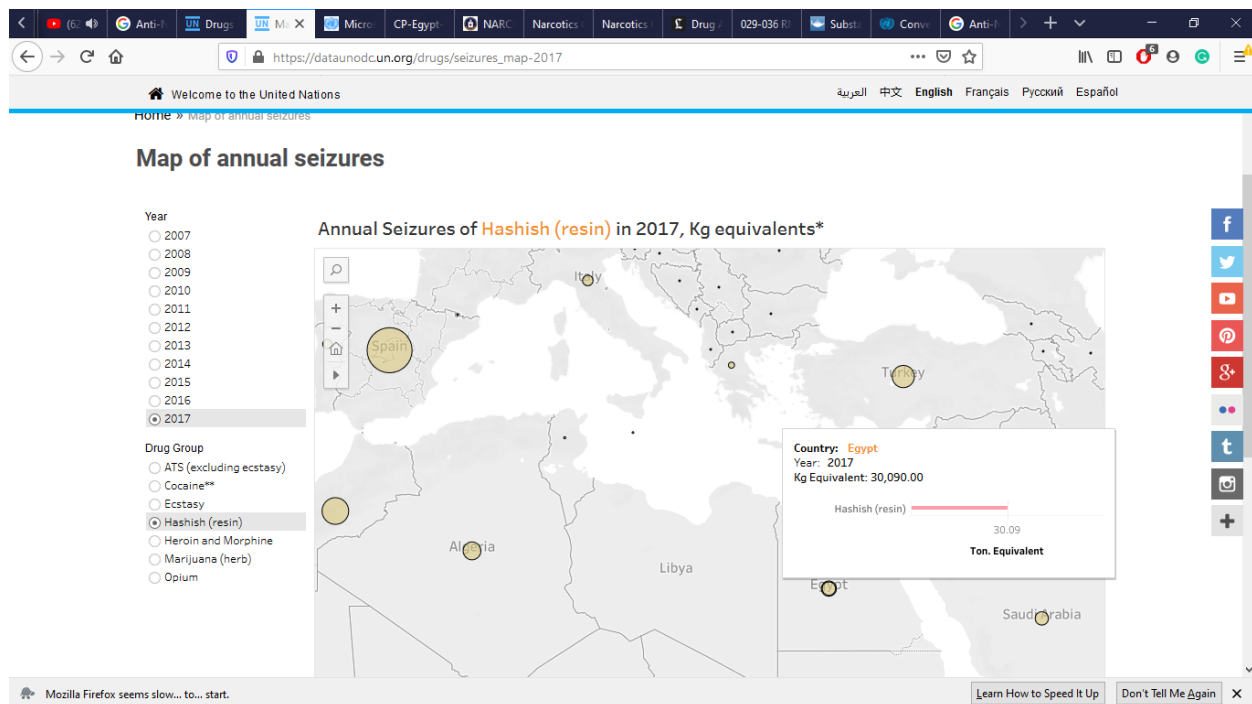

With the passage of the first Anti-Money Laundering Law in 2002, which criminalised the laundering of proceeds derived from trafficking in narcotics and numerous other crimes, seizures of currency in drug related cases has amounted to over 3,000,000 Egyptian Pounds (\$485,000). In 2004, ANGA opened a new office dedicated to financial investigations and combating money laundering.


According to the US State Department 2005 report, cannabis is grown year-round in the Northern and Southern Sinai and in Upper Egypt, while opium poppy is grown in the Southern Sinai only from November through March. Rugged terrain means that plots of illegal crops are small and irregularly shaped. ANGA combats this production by using aerial observation and confidential informants to identify illegal plots. Once the crops are located, ANGA conducts daylight eradication operations that consist of cutting and burning the plants.

Seizure of Cannabis weighing 1150 kg in the port of Misrata in Libya was seized before smuggling it to Egypt.



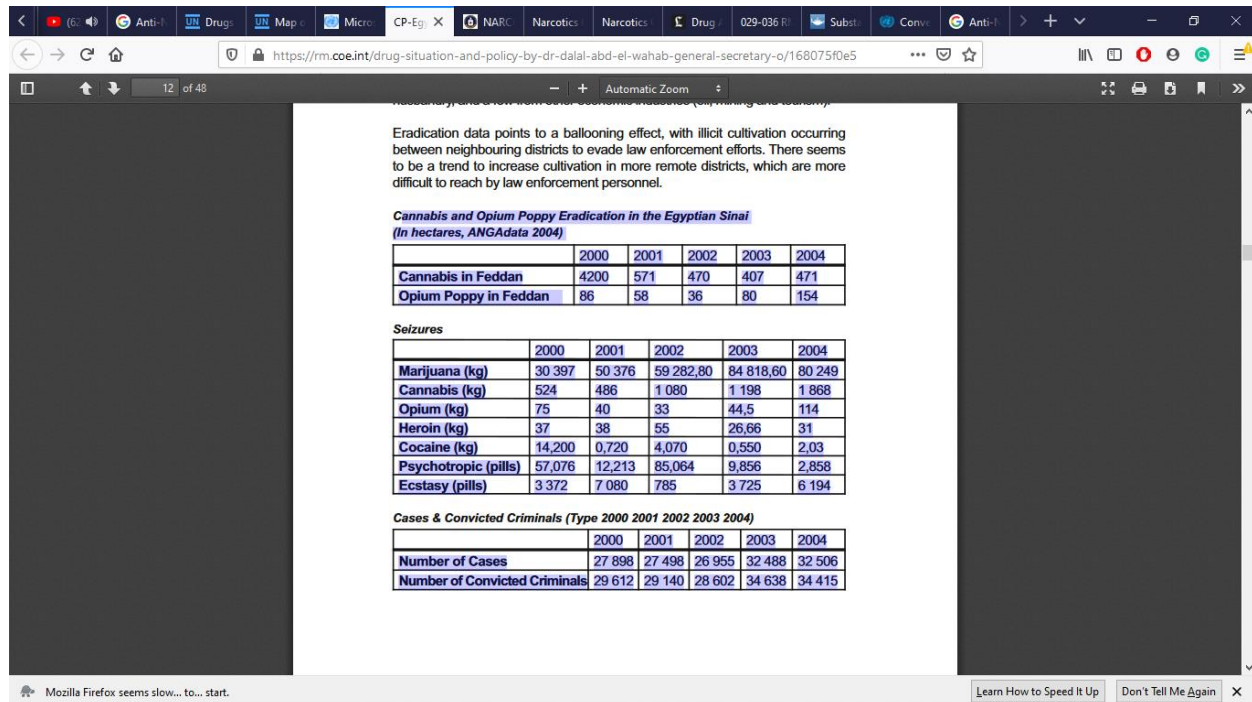
Egypt's location makes it a potential transit point for trafficking of heroin and cannabis from major production areas in South East Asia to European markets. On an international scale, the most vulnerable points in Egypt with regard to trafficking are the ports, airports and the Suez Canal for transit trafficking, mainly for heroin and cannabis. However, the average amounts seized are moderate, due to lack of interdiction capacity, particularly at the Cairo airport, which is assumed to be a transit hub for trafficking to Europe. Egypt may, therefore, play a significant role in the emerging southern trafficking gateway to Europe.

There have been alarming trends with regard to seizures of cannabis herb (Bango) within Egypt. Seizures of cannabis herb in Egypt in 2004 have increased significantly by 40% than 2003.

According to ANGA 2004 report, and according to the provisions of article 12 of the UN

early 1986 that antinarcotics efforts are a model for bilateral cooperation and an example of "symmetry of goals" between Egypt and the United States. The spokesman noted that Cairo's support for an international convention against narcotics was virtually identical to the US stand on the issue, and that Egypt was grateful for US backing in its effort to be a candidate for a seat on the UN Commission on Narcotic Drugs.

These cooperative antinarcotics efforts offer Cairo an opportunity to appear as an equal player in international events, as well as to play a role in reducing drug trafficking through the region.

Cairo asked West Germany in late 1986 to provide specialized training in antinarcotics enforcement techniques for six Egyptian police staff officers. Interior Minister Maj. Gen. Zaki Badr—who has major responsibility for the national antinarcotics program—told the Cairo press in June 1986 that Egypt and Italy would explore ways to cooperate in reducing their drug traffic and would share antinarcotics information.

**Pulling in the Mullahs: An Islamic Response to Drugs**

**Cairo's Antinarcotics Team**  
Current responsibilities for the national antidrug effort are split between two powerful ministries, Interior and Defense. Interior's Anti-Narcotics General Administration ostensibly is responsible for coordinating the overall program and has a specific mandate for enforcing antinarcotics laws in urban areas. The Ministry of Defense directs more than 17,000 men in the Coast Guard and the Border Guards and has the primary responsibility for interdiction of drugs on the high seas and on Egypt's borders.

The two programs are in direct competition for scarce monetary and personnel resources. Efforts in early 1986 to create a national narcotics coordinating body were apparently sabotaged by the Interior and Defense Ministers. Both ministers believe they would lose personal prestige and bureaucratic pull if their antidrug duties were brought under the control of a higher body, according to US Embassy accounts.

**Outlook and Opportunities for the United States**

The ministries of health and the interior have undertaken an anti-drug campaign. The heightened concern is prompted by two developments. In the past year, police officials say, there has been a sixfold increase in the quantity of drugs such as heroin and cocaine being smuggled into Egypt. Secondly, drug abuse is moving up-scale. To the alarm of legislators, law enforcement officials and parents, drug addiction is spreading among the young and educated elite.

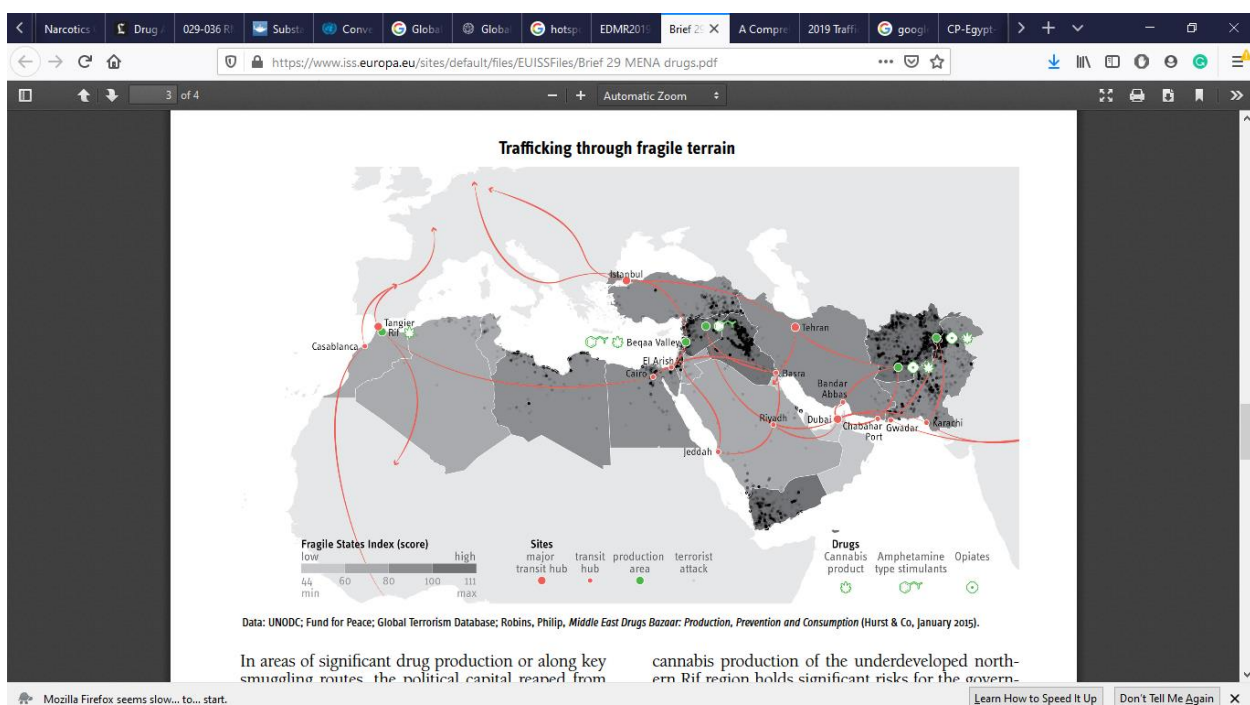

enforcement agencies (police, prosecution, customs, border control and immigration authorities), which play an important role in tracing the crime and the perpetrators to bring them to justice for deterrence. This paper will shed light upon three main national institutions that play an essential role in combating the crime from two different perspectives.

**A. Anti-Narcotics General Administration (ANGA)**

The Anti-Narcotics General Administration (ANGA) is Egypt's main agency responsible for overseeing anti-drug operations in the country. It is a specialized department in the Ministry of Interior (Police). To this end it undertakes a range of activities, including intercepting drug smuggling operations, seizing illicit drug manufacturing facilities and equipment, and confiscating drug proceeds. ANGA was first established in 1929, making it one of the oldest anti-drug organizations in the Arab world. It works with national law enforcement agencies and with foreign anti-narcotics agencies to achieve the aims of preventing the supply of illicit substances. In the past it has cooperated successfully on numerous occasions with the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) of the US, resulting in the seizure of large amounts of narcotics and drug-related


1Routes of trafficking due to fragility (source: Research by Georgios Barzoukas titled *'Drug trafficking in the MENA'*

analyzed through on-site visits, interviews and requests for information. After analyzing the information, some initial assumptions were confirmed while others proved to be unfounded due to changes in the market or local conditions. Information from one location sometimes led to information about other hotspots – some of which had not been initially considered. As this is the first time – to our knowledge – that such an approach has been taken, the GI would welcome further suggestions on other hotspots, and will continue to focus on different locations as part of the Observatory to counter organized crime in south-east Europe.

In analyzing the hotspots, certain characteristics emerged, the first and most obvious being location (see Figure 1). Furthermore, there are hotspots along major highways that are transit routes (north-south and east-west), as well as where major roads intersect. In some cases, the hotspots are in remote areas: along poorly monitored borders,

### Egypt Seizes \$178 Million in Money Laundering Crackdown

In just one year Egyptian authorities seized a record LE3.4 billion (US\$178 million) from money laundering crimes, government officials said on Tuesday.

A significant portion of this sum was being laundered through illegal drug trafficking channels in the country. Between June 2018 and May 2019, the **Interior Ministry** detected 61 cases of money laundering from drug trafficking.

These announcements came at an annual conference on combating money laundering crimes, which took place over three days in Cairo and focused primarily on the development of stronger laws and law enforcement techniques to battle the illegal drug trade.

In his last few years have been marred by drug abuse, cocaine (found in cough medicine) overdoses, failed attempts at rehab and expulsion from more than one university.

### Bite against crime

Last year, Egyptian police arrested at least 50,000 users and dealers and seized several tonnes of hashish, but experts say that applying punitive measures alone will not solve Egypt's drug problem.

The country has set up several anti-drug campaigns in an attempt to control the growing number of addicts, but they have so far proven ineffective.

Ehab el-Kharat, a psychiatrist and director of a number of rehabilitation centres in Egypt, says the government is failing to stem the tide of drug abuse because it is following the wrong priorities.

"They need to focus on kids who take up smoking cigarettes at the age of eight, school drop-outs or those who share a history of violence in their family ... they are not targeting the delinquents who fit the category," he said.

El-Kharat believes that most of Egypt's anti-drug campaigns are ineffective

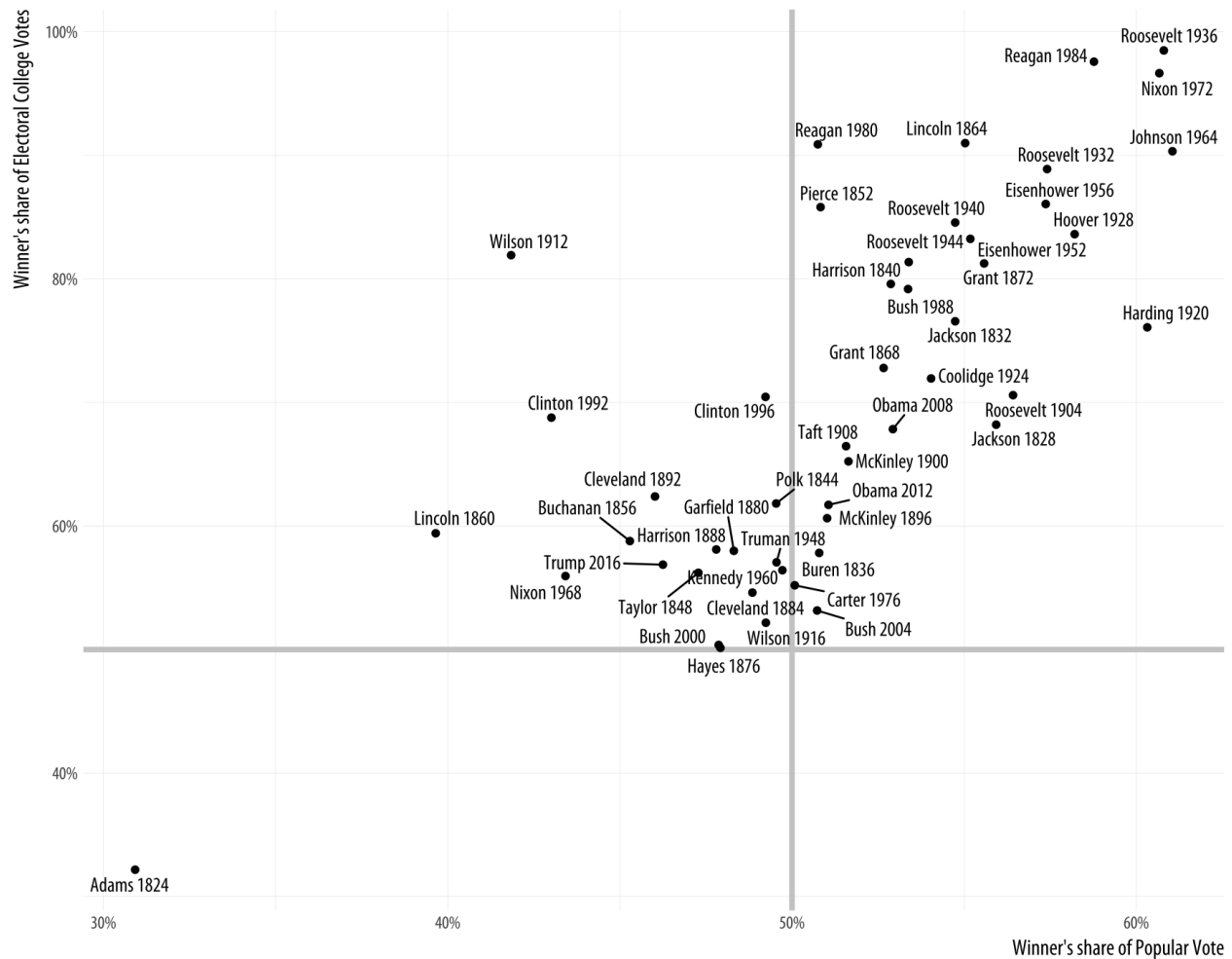

### Border guards seize 48 tons of drugs, 9.3M narcotic bills in 2019

CAIRO, Dec 30 (MENA) - In line with directives of the General Command of the Armed Forces, the border guards managed to seize nearly 48 tons of drugs (hashish, bango, heroin, opium and cocaine) and 9.3 million tons of narcotic bills and destroy 373 feddans planted with cannabis during 2019.

They also succeeded in seizing 1,027 pieces of firearms, 850,000 bullets, 206 gun magazines, six binoculars (field glasses) and 105 kg of explosives.

Translated to: In an interview with him in his exile in Spain: Muhammad Ali fears he will be assassinated after the wave of protests that sparked it in Egypt

In a press interview with the Guardian with Egyptian businessman Mohamed Ali in his exile in Barcelona, "Ali" expressed his deep concern that he would be assassinated by the Egyptian agencies due to the waves of protest that have afflicted the Egyptian streets in the past weeks after his calls by the Egyptians to demonstrate against Abdel Fattah El-Sisi, in A rare behavior that Egypt has not seen in years under Sisi rule.

"Ali" added in his dialogue that he feels a great responsibility towards the hundreds who were arrested because of their participation in the demonstrations that took place against Sisi, or their calls to participate in them, stressing that he is in a "state of shock" because of the presence of hundreds in prison because of him, as he stated, stressing that his battle to overthrow Al-Sisi has not finished yet, and will enter a new stage, especially as many army officers support his calls to eradicate corruption, according to his allegations.

The videos that Mohamed Ali posted on social media over the past weeks have sparked tidal waves of anger against Sisi, after being accused in a ridiculous manner of corruption and squandering public funds in light of imposing austerity policies on the Egyptian people, 32.5% of whom live below the poverty line.

The relatively small protests that started on September 20, were followed by a widespread campaign of arrests that included about 4321 people, according to the Egyptian Committee for Rights and Freedoms monitoring.

After these protests, Muhammad Ali made an appeal to the Egyptians asking them to take to the streets in Millionaire on Friday, September 27, but the authorities had vowed to those calls, and announced that they would use force to suppress these demonstrations, which was relatively successful.

Commenting on this, Mohamed Ali announced that he has stopped publishing more videos in the current period, as this is an implicit admission from him that his calls to mobilize people on the streets have failed.

Muhammad Ali stated in the press interview that he now plays an important role in unifying the ranks of groups and parties opposing the current regime in Egypt, from liberals or Muslim Brotherhood, or other groups, so that a new force is ready to overthrow Sisi, who came to power in Egypt after the 2013 coup, Then he would lead a crackdown against freedom of opinion and expression, and eliminate the opposition in all its forms, which was considered by observers to the situation in Egypt as the worst campaign in the history of modern Egypt.

Ali revealed that he received invitations from various opposition groups to join them in their

exile in Istanbul and Qatar, but he rejected those invitations, stressing his adherence to staying in Spain.

As they come to associate numerous interpersonal cues as dangerous, such as a slight change of facial expression, a particular tone of voice, or certain types of body posturing, they can find themselves going back to a place of response that is familiar to them in an effort to prepare and protect themselves.

Security sources: Egyptian activist tortured to death.

An Egyptian activist who died Monday was beaten unconscious during interrogation at a security camp where he was detained for three days, two security sources told Reuters Tuesday.

The security sources spoke to Reuters on condition of anonymity as they are not authorized to speak to journalists.

Human rights campaigners say the same brutal tactics that helped ignite the uprising against autocrat Hosni Mubarak two years ago are back under the auspices of freely elected President Mohamed Morsy.

Mohamed al-Gendy was rounded up along with other youth protesters on 25 January, the second anniversary of the start of the anti-Mubarak revolt, and taken to Gabal Ahmar, a state security camp on the outskirts of Cairo.

Gendy remained there for three days and nights where he was "interrogated" and beaten, the sources said, adding that the officers were more aggressive when he talked back to them.

The Spain-based Egyptian exile began releasing videos on YouTube in early September that quickly went [viral](#) on social media, with some Egyptians referring to Ali's broadcasts as "better than Netflix".

Ali urged people to continue protests on Friday, telling them not to fear arrest or violence by security forces but also to stay on the move and not to form sit-ins like those previously organised in Rabaa Square, because this could make them an easier target.

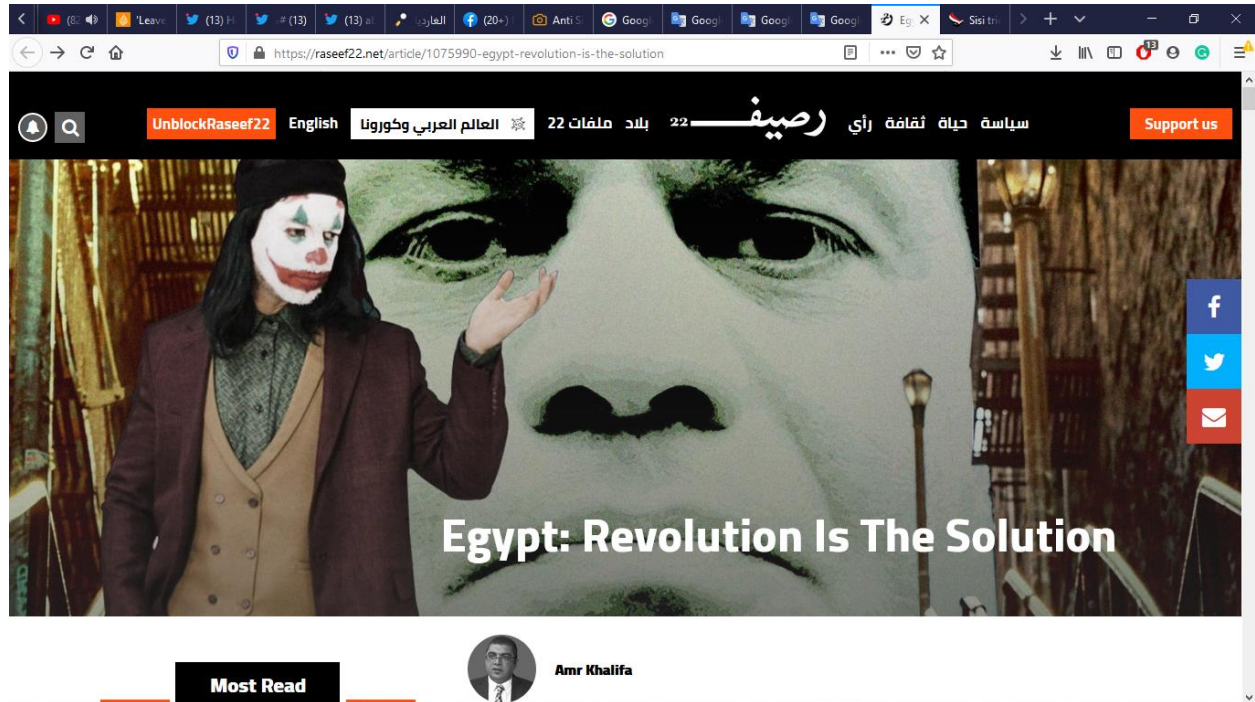
